



Insulated Wine Tote

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Insulated Wine Bag

A cute and easy to construct insulated wine bag. This bag will keep wine chilled. Perfect for a spring-time picnic. Sample used Monkey Wrench Block.

Fabric Needed

Unfinished quilt block
Bag fabric

One 16.5cm (6½") square
.5m

Materials Needed

Legacy L-975 Insul-Fleece™
Two buttons

.25m

Tools Needed

Rotary Cutting tools and mat
Ruler
Sewing machine and related supplies

Assembly

Step 1. Cutting Instructions.

Cut one 6½" quilt block down to 6¼" square.
 Cut two 4½" x 6¼" rectangles.
 Cut two 1½" x 14¼" strips.
 Cut one 8¼" x 14¼" rectangle for back.
 Cut two 8¼" x 14¼" rectangles for lining.
 Cut one 4" x 18" rectangle for handle.
 Cut two 8¼" x 14¼" rectangles from Insul-Fleece™.

Step 1. Sew 4½" x 6¼" rectangles to the top and bottom of the quilt block, right sides together. Press seams toward block.

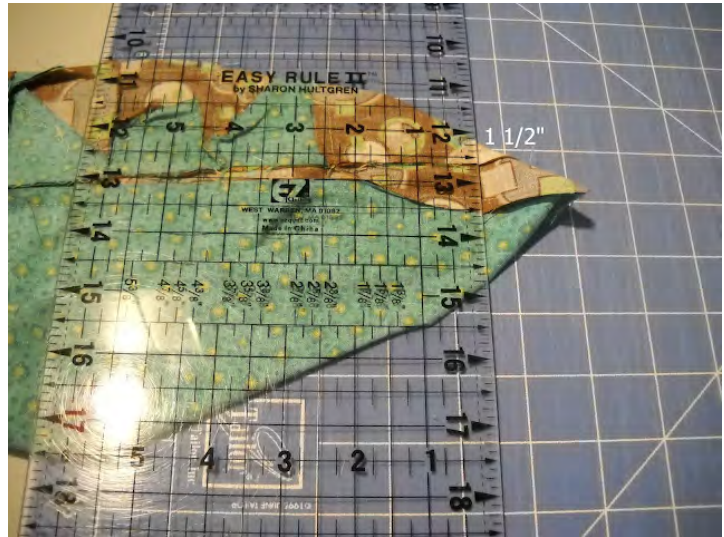


Step 2. Sew 1½" x 14¼" strips to each side of bag. Press seam toward center.



Step 3. Stitch bag front and bag back right sides together on sides and bottom.

Step 4. Box in corners 1½". Turn bag right side out.



Step 5. Sew Insul-Fleece™ to wrong side of lining piece using ⅛" seam allowance.

Step 6. Stitch lining pieces right sides together on the sides and the bottom, leaving a 2" opening on the side for turning. Box corners on bottom of lining the same way as for the outer bag.

Step 7. Handles - fold handle piece in half lengthwise, right sides together and stitch on the side and across the bottom. Turn handles right side out and fold the unfinished edge in ½" and stitch closed. Press and top stitch 3 rows of stitching on the handle.

Step 8. Place outer bag inside lining, right sides together. Stitch around the top of the bag.

Step 9. Turn bag right side out through opening in bag lining. Slip stitch opening closed and push lining into the bag.

Step 10. Top stitch around the top edge of the bag ¼" down from the top.

Step 11. Fold each end of the handle up 1" and stitch to the sides of the bag with buttons.
