

# Makeup Brush Roll Skill Level: Beginner

The Makeup Brush Roll is an easy solution for what to do with all of your favorite makeup brushes while traveling. It is easy to sew and incredibly functional. Use your favorite fabrics to create something that your friends will envy! Finished size is  $21.6 \text{cm} \times 29.2 \text{cm} (8\frac{1}{2}\text{"} \times 11\frac{1}{2}\text{"})$ .

### **Fabrics Needed**

Exterior fabric 50cm Lining, pocket and closure strings 50cm

#### **Materials Needed**

Legacy L-987 Fusible Fleece White 50cm Legacy L-SF101 Cotton Woven Fusible 50cm

Thread

#### **Tools Needed**

Sewing machine and related supplies Rotary cutter and related supplies Fabric Marker

## Assembly

Step 1. Cutting instructions.

Cut one 9" x 12" rectangle from exterior fabric.

Cut one 9" x 12" rectangle from lining fabric.


Cut one 8" x 12" rectangle from the exterior or lining fabric for


Cut two 1½" x 12" strips from exterior or lining fabric for closure strings.


Cut two 9" x 12" rectangles from Fusible Fleece White. Cut one 8" x 12" rectangles from Cotton Woven Fusible.

Step 2. Place the rectangles of Fusible Fleece White on the wrong side of the 9" x 12" rectangles of exterior and lining fabric. Fuse both pieces following manufacturer's instructioins.

Step 3. Place the rectangle of Cotton Woven Fusible on the wrong side of the 8" x 12" rectangle of fabric. Fuse following manufacturer's instructions. After fusing, fold the the pocket piece in half lengthwise, wrong sides together. Press.

















Step 6. Topstitch 1/8" from open edge to finish closure strings.



Step 7. Topstitch ¼" from fold edge of pocket piece.



Step 8. To create brush pockets, lay each brush (or other tool) along folded pocket piece, keeping a border of at least  $\frac{1}{2}$ " from each edge of the fabric. Adjust spacing to allow for various brush or tool sizes, adding  $\frac{1}{2}$ " - 1" to account for item depth.




Step 9. Draw dividing lines with a fabric marker. To test size, pin pockets in place and insert desired brushes.



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Step 10. Place pocket piece on top of lining fabric, matching the bottom corners and raw edges.

Step 11. Sew along the lines created with the fabric marker. Insert brushes to check pocket sizes.








Step 13. Place the exterior fabric piece and the lining piece right sides together. Pin together, then sew all sides with a ¼" seam allowance, leaving a 4" gap at the top for turning. Make sure the closure strings are inside, between the two layers of fabric.

Step 14. Cut corners diagonally close to the stitching to create a better point once turned.

Step 15. Tuck the open edges in and pin so that the edge matches the rest of the case.







Step 17. Press to finish, insert brushes, roll, and tie the closure strings into a bow.



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
