


Double Nine Patch On-Point Set Table Runner Skill Level: Intermediate

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This $36\text{cm} \times 104\text{cm} (16" \times 41")$ table runner makes a nice hostess gift item. A festive choice of fabric will bring joy to any holiday table. The combination of Insul-FleeceTM topped with cotton batting provides a safe place to put hot dishes. See also the companion Double Nine-Patch Straight Set Table Runner.

Fabrics Needed

Fabric A 63cm
Fabric B 50cm
Fabric C Fat Quarter
Fabric D 63cm (includes 25cm for binding)
Backing 50cm

Materials Needed

Legacy L-975 Insul-Fleece[™] 50cm Legacy L-NB-96 Natural Cotton Batting 50cm Thread

Tools Needed

Sewing machine and related tools Rotary cutter and related supplies

Assembly



Use 1/4" seam allowances throughout.

Step 1. Cutting instructions.

Cut five 1½" strips.
Cut four 1½" strips.
Cut twelve 3½" squares.

Setting Triangles

Fabric D Cut two 9% squares. Fabric D Cut one 104 square.


For Borders

Fabric B Cut three 1" strips.
Fabric A Cut three 23/4" strips.

The Block-9"

Step 2. Use block strips to sew block units as shown. Press toward the dark.




Step 3. Cut block units into 11/2" strips.




Step 4. Sew strips into 9-patch blocks as shown, press to one side. Make fifteen.



Step 5. Sew rows using the 9-patch blocks and the plain fabric C blocks as shown. Press towards fabric C.




Make 6 of these rows




Make 3 of these rows


Step 6. Sew rows into blocks as shown. Make 3 blocks.




Step 7. Cut the two 9%" squares in half diagonally from corner to corner as shown.




Step 8. Cut the one $10\frac{1}{4}$ square into quarters from corner to corner as shown.



Step 9. Sew triangles onto blocks as shown.




Step 10. Sew remaining triangles onto both ends as shown.




Step 11. Cut two strips Fabric B 1" x 12 3/4". Sew these strips on both ends of the table runner, press towards border strips.



Step 12. Cut two strips Fabric B 1" x 39". Sew these strips on the top and bottom of the table runner, press towards border strips.



Step 13. Cut two strips Fabric A 1 1/2" x 13 3/4". Sew these strips on both ends of the table runner. Press towards border.



Step 14. Cut two strips Fabric A 1 1/2" x 42". Sew these strips to the top and bottom of the table runner. Press towards border strips.



Step 15. Cut the backing $17" \times 41"$. Press. Place backing on table, right side down. Cut the Insul-FleeceTM and cotton batting the same size as the backing. Lay the Insul-FleeceTM on the backing first and smooth. Insulfleece does not have a right or wrong side. Lay the cotton batting on top of that. Smooth carefully. Place the table runner on top of the cotton batting, right side up. Smooth and pin all layers together

Step 16. Quilt all layers together, either in the ditch or by meandering.

Step 17. Making binding. Sew binding on quilt.
