Add creativity to your holiday table with the addition of this table runner in festive Christmas colors or orange, green and yellow for Thanksgiving. This  $41 \text{cm} \times 101 \text{cm} (16^{"} \times 40^{"})$  table runner makes a nice hostess gift item. The combination of Insul-Fleece<sup>TM</sup> topped with cotton batting provides a safe place to put hot dishes.



# Assembly



Use ¼" seam allowances throughout.

Step 1. Cutting instructions.

For Blocks	
Fabric A	Cut five 11/2" strips
Fabric B	Cut four 1½" strips
Fabric C	Cut twelve 3½" squares

**For Cornerstones** 

Fabric A Cut eight 2" squares

**For Sashing** 

Fabric D Cut ten 2" x 9½" rectangles


**For Borders** 

Fabric B Cut three 1½" strips
Fabric A Cut three 3" strips

The Block-9"


Step 2. Use block strips to create block units as shown. Press toward the dark.




Step 3. Cut units into 1½" strips.




Step 4. Sew strips into 9-patch blocks as shown, press to one side. Make fifteen blocks.



Step 5. Sew rows using the 9-patch blocks and the plain fabric C blocks as shown. Press towards fabric C.




Make 6 of these rows




Make 3 of these rows

Step 6. Sew rows into block as shown. Make 3 blocks.




Step 7. Sew a sashing strip to the sides of each block, creating the center unit of the table runner. Press toward sashing strips.




Step 8. Sew sashing strips to cornerstones as shown. Make two.




Step 9. Sew the two sashing strip units to the top and bottom of the center unit as shown. Press towards sashing.




Step 10. Cut the 1  $\frac{1}{2}$ " border strips into four pieces, two 1  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 12" and two 1  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 35". Sew the two short pieces on the ends of the table runner using a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance. Press outward toward the border (unless pressing towards white fabric).




Step 11. Sew the two longer pieces on the top and bottom of the table runner using a ¼" seam allowance. Press towards the border.



Step 12. For outside border, cut two pieces 3" x 14" and two pieces 3" x 40". Sew the two short pieces on each end of the table runner as shown. Press outward toward the border.



Step 13. Sew the two longer pieces on the top and bottom of the table runner using a ¼" seam allowance. Press towards the border.



Step 14. Cut the backing  $17" \times 41"$ . Press. Place backing on table, right side down. Cut the Insul-Fleece<sup>TM</sup> and cotton batting the same size as the backing. Lay the Insul-Fleece<sup>TM</sup> on the backing first and smooth. Insulfleece does not have a right or wrong side. Lay the cotton batting on top of that. Smooth carefully. Place the table runner on top of the cotton batting, right side up. Smooth and pin all layers together

Step 15. Quilt all layers together, either in the ditch or by meandering.

Step 16. Make binding. Sew binding to quilt.

TIP: Insul-Fleece™ contains polyester which will melt at about 400°. Always add a layer of 100% cotton batting whever an item as hot as 400° could be placed next to the Insul-Fleece™. The metallic mylar reflects and retains temperatures hot or cold. Do not use in a microwave.
